ARTICLE 4 FY'24 SPENDING LIMITS FOR REVOLVING FUNDS

The Town voted to authorize the following total expenditures for the following revolving funds, in amounts not to exceed the listed amounts, pursuant to General Laws Chapter 44, Section 53E ½ for the Fiscal Year 2024: (Davenport)

ARTICLE 5 ENTERPRISE FUND: TRANSFER STATION (C. Rivest)

The Town voted to appropriate the following amounts for the Transfer Station: \$34,740.67 for Salaries

\$64,194.54 for Trash Hauling & Materials Recovery Facility Contract \$1,650 for Miscellaneous Expenses; and that \$100,585.21 be raised from Transfer Station Enterprise Fund receipts.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 6 COMMUNITY PRESERVATION COMMITTEE (D. Boyd)

The Town voted to appropriate \$63,300 from the Community Preservation Fund for the purchase of a 13.7-acre parcel at 0 Walnut Road for conservation purposes by the Minnechaug Land Trust; or take any other action relative thereto.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

The Town voted to appropriate \$45,000 from the Community Preservation Fund for the purchase of adaptive playground equipment at the Green Meadow School by the Hampden Wilbraham Regional School District; or take any other action relative thereto.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 7 CONSERVATION FUND (T. Zebert)

The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$1,000 for the Conservation Fund, said fund to be used for the purpose of acquiring available land for the Town for conservation purposes, if said purchase is voted and approved at an Annual or Special Town Meeting prior to such purchase.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 8 CHAPTER 90 - STATE HIGHWAYAID (J. Flynn)

The Town voted to accept \$251,969.39 from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts under the General Laws, Chapter 90, Section 34, and be allowed to borrow in anticipation of 100% reimbursement.

A 2/3rds Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 9 LIBRARY ADDITIONAL STATE AID (Library)

The Town voted that, in fiscal year 2024, if state aid is received for the Hampden Public Library, this money will be made available to Library Trustees for use at their discretion.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 10 TREE STUMP REMOVAL

(Jennifer Bagge)

The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$3,200 to fund removal of tree stumps at the South Road entrance to the Minnechaug Mountain Conservation Land.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 11 FIRE TRUCK RENOVATION

(Fire Chief)

The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$10,000 for the Fire Department for the renovation of Fire Engine #2.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 12 FUNDING TO MAINTAIN THE TOWN'S DEFIBRILLATORS

The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$5,820 for required maintenance of the Town's twelve defibrillators. (J. Flynn)

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 13 LOCAL MATCH FOR A FEMA GRANT FOR A FIRE DEPARTMENT FORESTRY TRUCK (Fire Chief)

The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$10,952.39 to provide local match for a FEMA grant to replace the Fire Department's 1953 forestry truck.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 14 NEW DUMP TRUCK FOR THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$222,465 for the Highway Department to replace a 1993 Mack dump truck. (D. Davenport)

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 15 ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR THE MASTER PLAN (Planning)

The Town voted to hear a report from the Planning Board but take no action on this article.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 16 CITIZEN'S PETITION

(Jim Smith)

The Town voted to create a "Receipts Reserved for Ambulance Fund" to receive funds collected from ambulance transports by the Hampden Fire Department.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 17 FIBER OPTIC PROGRAM BORROWING (C. Rivest)

The Town voted to take no action on this article.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 18 SENIOR CENTER DESIGN FUNDING (D. Collins)

The Town voted to take no action on this article.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 19 ACCESSORY APARTMENT ZONING (Planning)

The Town voted to amend the Hampden Zoning Code by first adding subsection 3, the text of which is set out in the warrant, to Subsection 6.11 of Section 6.1, and then adding to Section 2 "Definitions" a new Definition 2.1, the text of which is set out in the warrant and then renumbering Section 2 as required.

A 2/3rds Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 20 EASEMENT FOR NATIONAL GRID (J. Flynn)

The Town voted to authorize the Board of Selectmen to grant an easement to the Massachusetts Electric Company, known as National Grid, to construct and maintain an overhead system of poles and lines in conjunction with a ground mounted solar project east of Cross Road and adjacent to the Town transfer station.

A 2/3rds Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 21 FUNDING FOR HAMPDEN'S 150th ANNIVERSARY EVENTS

The Town voted pursuant to General Laws Chapter 44, Section 53I to raise and appropriate \$10,000 to the fund for the celebration in 2028 of Hampden's 150th anniversary as an independent town. (J. Flynn)

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 22 ASSESSOR'S FUNDING FOR STATE MANDATES (Assessors)

The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$16,000 to the Assessor's Department for Fiscal 2024 Massachusetts Department of Revenue mandated requirements.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 23 SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER (C. Rivest)

The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$11,650 to fund the School Resource Officer for fiscal year 2023 at Minnechaug Regional High School.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 24 ADVISORY COMMITTEE RESERVE FUND (Advisory)

The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$25,000 for the Advisory Committee Reserve Fund.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 25 GENERAL STABILIZATION FUND

(Advisory)

The Town voted to take no action on this article.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 26 REDUCING THE TAX RATE

(Advisory)
