Early in 1932 the Selectmen and State Engineers made out a budget for the maintenance of various highways of the town, under Chapter 81. The following represent the work done during the year 1932.

Under Chap. 90, 3,200 feet of asphalt bound macadam was constructed on Somers Road, continuing the work started the preceding year. This year an appropriation is being asked for to complete this road to the State line.

Allen Street construction was started this year and 2,000 feet completed. The State Engineers, together with the Commissioner of Public Works, decided to try out a new type of road, "TRC" or "temperature resisting cement," and awarded a contract to Fred T. Ley & Co., Inc., to construct the surface, at a price lower than the asphalt surface would be, the Ley Co. guaranteeing the surface for one year. An allotment has been asked from the State and County to continue the work.

At the December meeting with the County Commissioners, an allotment was asked for to finish tarring

Scantic Road and to start the North Monson Road.

The Board of Public Welfare distributed for the American Red Cross 80 bags of flour, 250 yards of cloth, and several dozen garments. This has been a great help to some families as it has saved them from asking help from the Welfare Department.
